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On Friday, November 26th, a one-man art show by Alberto Di Fabio, called *ri-impianto*, is opening at Umberto Di Marino Contemporary Art gallery.

Alberto Di Fabio artistic survey is always based on environmental themes. His work develops itself through big installations, consisting of particular paintings on Chinese paper, which represent a real exploration in the material structure and a rediscovery of the elements that compose the nature, suggesting in that way an alternative to the deterioration of the environment caused by man's pollution.

The artist engagement for ecology becomes active when, discovered a rubbish dump in one of most beautiful and uncontaminated landscape of Italy, the island of Ponza, he decides to undertake an hard performance: to plant, long the dump perimeter, about three hundred of all sorts of plants, with the intent of a progressive territory reafforestation. So the title of this exhibition is born during which, nearby the pictorial installations, the performance images will be shown: ri-impianto, therefore, because the artist, regretting the damage that man has caused to the nature, replants the nature itself so that it can regain its beauty and its territory.

Alberto Di Fabio was born in Avezzano (L'Aquila) in 1966. Lives and works in Rome and New York.
