If it's space then frankly I'm GREEN with envy. The pathos of living and going about in this world. Without wanting to sound meaningless, I'll say it's all of those things. Unfortunately flying is the most polluting thing that a private person can do to the atmosphere. Perhaps we can leave that role to sci-fi scenarios of natural disasters and collapses of the future world. The drama is the link, even among the younger generations.
